Topic: Global NFS draft resolution

Proposed by: India

- 01) THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY,
- 02) *Bearing in mind* the danger posed by nuclear, biological,
- 03) chemical, and radiological weapons to not only military targets
- 04) but also the population of the world as a whole, and the risk to
- 05) civilization and the environment,
- 06) *Concerned* with the nuclear stockpiles held by the world, which
- 07) numbers nearly 26,000 nuclear weapons including several
- 08) thousand thermonuclear devices,
- 09) *Deeply concerned* with the South Asian tensions, specifically the
- 10) alleged acts of state-sponsored terrorism by Pakistan against
- 11) Afghanistan, Uzbekistan, United States of America, United
- 12) Kingdom, China, and most recently India, and fearing the
- 13) outbreak of nuclear war between China, India, and Pakistan,
- 14) *Also concerned* with the ethnic and religious conflict in the
- 15) middle east, specifically the tension between Israel and its
- 16) neighbors, and the advancement of the Iranian nuclear
- 17) programme,
- 18) *Welcoming* the end of the Cold War and the obsolescence of Cold
- 19) War style defenses and hostilities,
- 20) *Reaffirming* the resolutions reached at the Geneva Convention
- 21) concerning biological and chemical weapons,
- 22) *Fully believing* that nuclear war is entirely undesirable not only
- 23) to would-be belligerents but also the global community,
- 24) 1. Calls on all Governments to adopt a no-first-strike policy
- 25) with regard to all nuclear, biological, chemical, and
- 26) radiological devices under the following guidelines:
- 27) a) No nation, government organization, NGO,

- 28) or other party shall be the first to fire a nuclear or
29) radiological weapon;
30) b) The use and manufacture of chemical and biological
31) weapons shall be discontinued citing the inefficiency,
32) inhumanity, and ambient danger of such devices;
- 33) 2. Endorses the concept of a programme entirely distinct from
34) the NPT for the reduction of nuclear arsenals;
- 35) 3. Further recommends a revision of the Nuclear Non-
36) Proliferation Treaty from a global standpoint rather than that
37) of simply NATO and Warsaw Pact nations that includes an
38) increased support for transparent nuclear programmes and a
39) reduction of the stigma against nations that develop a
40) nuclear programme on their own;
- 41) 4. Further reminds the international community of the
42) devastating global effects of even a localized thermonuclear
43) war;
- 44) 5. Decides to remain actively seized of the matter.
