DELEGATE CODE OF CONDUCT**

Each delegate to the MUN conference is expected to represent their school and themselves in an appropriate manner that brings credit to the school and to themselves.

**Obey the Law:**

All Delegates must abide by all city, state, and federal laws, including but not limited to, those pertaining to alcohol, narcotics, cigarettes, and weapon possession. Furthermore, delegates are expected to obey all rules established by their respective schools for field trips as well as any additional rules established by their advisors. If a Delegate chooses to violate this basic rule, they may be sent home.

**Transportation and Lodging:**

Independent transportation and/or lodging are NOT acceptable for any delegate during the conference. Delegates come to the OHSIRL conference as representatives of their school and thus should stay and travel with their school. Any other arrangements must be made with the consent of their school administration in conjunction with the leadership of OHSIRL.

**Curfew:**

All Delegates must be in their hotel complex by the assigned curfew of midnight. Additional curfew restrictions are the responsibility of the school advisors.

**Attendance:**

In order for the model to work each country must be represented well. Delegates are expected to be in attendance for all general sessions as well as committee meetings. They are expected to be on time so as not to delay debate or discussion.

**Simulation:** To the best of their abilities delegates are expected to accurately represent the country they have been assigned.

**Dress Code:**

Delegates agree to the dress code for the Spring Conference which is Western Business Attire. Midriffs, hats, ripped clothing, and casual street clothing are not acceptable. No spaghetti straps and no flip flops or high heels. Delegates may be walking a lot and must have shoes that allow this. Also delegates may not wear costumes from the country they are representing.

**Respect:**

While at the Spring Conference, delegates will be seen as representatives of their school, the OHSIRL Model United Nations Program and should behave accordingly by showing respect to other delegates, the rights of the property we are allowed to utilize while on the campus of the University of Oregon, and to those individuals which they will come into contact with.

**Electronic Devices:**

All electronic devices must remain turned off during committee and general sessions, including cell phones, pagers, I-Pods, or MP3 players etc. Laptops may only be used during informal discussions. OHSIRL is not responsible for lost or stolen electronics.

**Committee Conduct:**

One of the best parts of the MUN Conference is what takes place during debate within committees. You are expected to follow the rules, work within the process, and strive for excellence in the exchange of ideas. Delegates should demonstrate respect for the Committee Chairs.

**Safety:**

Delegates should not engage in activities that might endanger themselves or others. This includes but not limited to leaving the motels after curfew, walking alone at night, or deceiving advisors about their whereabouts.
