THE HUMAN RIGHTS COMMITTEE,

Aware of the growing problems of refugee discrimination throughout the world,

Acknowledging that safety is a human right,

Recognizing that this right is not given equally to all peoples,

Noting with deep concern that some countries aren't stable or prepared enough to welcome refugees,

- 1. <u>Calls upon</u> countries to work together to support/house/welcome refugees instead of solely bearing the burden on one country;
- 2. <u>Creates</u> a program for the safe movement of refugees from temporary housing to permanent housing in other countries;
- 3. <u>Requests</u> countries with the political, economic, and physical stability to house refugees;
- 4. <u>Encourages</u> funding from more economically developed nations to allocate funding towards the aiding of refugees towards asylum;
- 5. Mandates the respectful treatment of refugees,
 - a. Implementing governmental protocols to monitor their treatments;
- 6. <u>Discourages</u> decisions as to which refugees to allow into a country based upon bias about race, nationality, education, and socioeconomic status;
- 7. <u>Motions</u> for further UN discussions to determine whether or not a country is politically, economically, or physically able to support refugees
- 8. <u>Strongly urges</u> the creation of a benchmark to assess a country's eligibility to take in refugees, based on population, economic and social stability, land size, bias statistics, geographical resources, and proximity;
- 9. <u>Decides</u> to remain actively seized of the matter.
