Subject: Surveillance of People Post Pandemic

Proposed by: Venezuela

THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY,

Considering the potential of surveillance for advancements in public health through measures such as contact tracing,

Noting how surveillance can be used to protect a countries citizens and interests,

Recognizing that in Article 12 of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, no one shall be subjected to arbitrary interference with his privacy, family, home or correspondence, nor to attacks upon his honor and reputation,

Aware of the possible biases in facial recognition technology,

- 1. <u>Urges</u> countries to prohibit unnecessary tracking and surveillance of citizens, unless an appropriate and specific reason can be established;
- 2. <u>Recommends</u> that the countries administering this surveillance be the ones establishing appropriate and specific reasons;
- 3. <u>Allows</u> countries to utilize artificial intelligence and facial recognition technology to track criminal activity and monitor public health, with the same appropriate and specific criteria listed above;
- 4. <u>Discourages</u> facial recognition/artificial intelligence as the sole method of determining one's identity;
- 5. <u>Advocates</u> for the use of this technology along with conventional evidence (tangible objects such as documents, DNA, etc.) to verify one's identity;
- 6. <u>Prohibits</u> the sale of all data by countries to third-parties using surveillance technology for profit.
