Topic: Human Capital Flight from Developing Nations

Proposed by: France, Venezuela, Switzerland

THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY,

Alarmed at the loss of medical personnel from developing countries and the effects that their flight leave behind,

Striving to support the efforts to reduce the loss of human capital from developing nations,

Considering that 8% of college graduate nationals from lower/lower-middle income countries live abroad compared to 4% in high-income countries,

- 1. <u>Recommends</u> the creation of a UN fund directed towards developing education and medical infrastructure, such as schools and hospitals, in nations in need of skilled laborers:
- 2. Advocates for voluntary contributions as the source of funding;
- 3. <u>Utilizes</u> the above fund in hopes that this aid would be delivered in return for greater commitments and goals in the field of human rights in these developing nations;
 - a. Focusing on the rights outlined in the 1948 UN summit;
- 4. <u>Advises</u> the creation of programs such as RQAN, which would assist highly skilled, qualified individuals in returning and reintegrating in their home developing nation;
- 5. <u>Suggests</u> improving living and working conditions so there are fewer reasons for workers to move away from their country;
- 6. <u>Encourages</u> nations to promote and fund education and necessary careers for their citizens, to increase brain capital and nations GDP.
