Subject: The Increase of Devastating Heat Waves in South Asia Due to Climate Change Proposed By: The United Kingdom, France Endorsed By: South Africa, The United States, Spain, Colombia, Belize, Qatar, Iraq, Venezuela, Peru, Islamic Republic of Iran, Kenya, Turkey, Philippines

THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY,

Concerned about the rise in extreme heat waves in South Asia, as well as increasing amounts of drastic weather conditions worldwide, and the harm these conditions are causing to civilians,

Recognizing that such extreme effects are due in large part to man-made climate change, *Supporting* the efforts of many nations to decrease their emissions levels in the hopes of meeting the standards set by the Paris Agreement,

Aware that such efforts may not prove enough to decrease the effects of climate change to a sufficient degree,

- <u>Suggests</u> respectfully for affected countries to implement the smaller-scale strategy of diversifying planted crops and planting seeds that are more resilient to extreme weather conditions;
- Encourages countries to invest in local, renewable, sustainable energy sources (such as solar power, hydropower, wind power) for the purposes of as many developed nations as possible being at least 30% renewable by 2050;

- 3. <u>Proposes</u> that members nations sign a climate contract to pool the equivalent amount of 0.001% of a country's GDP in USD together (that can be raised and lowered in the case of economic circumstances) for the purposes of aiding developing nations in developing climate change fighting technologies and providing immediate, accessible disaster relief and healthcare to citizens affected by climate change;
- 4. <u>Recommends</u> that if countries do not meet this set and agreed upon amount and break their contract, that the contract is renegotiated.
